Useful Acronyms and Terms

BAA: Broad Agency Announcement (used mainly by DOD to announce new programs)

<u>Budget Functions</u>: The Budget Resolution recommends totals of new budget authority and outlays by functional category. The following budget functions contain the agencies that AAU tracks:

Function 050 (National Defense)

Function 250 (Science, Space and Technology)

Function 500 (Education, Training, Employment and Social Services - Higher Ed)

Function 550 (Health)

<u>Dear Colleague Letter:</u> A mass-produced letter usually initiated by an advocacy group and sent by one or more Members of Congress to all members. "Dear Colleagues" usually describe a new bill and ask for cosponsors or ask for a member's vote on an issue.

<u>Defense S&T Accounts</u>: The defense S&T program consists of three accounts: basic research (6.1), applied research (6.2) and advanced technology development (6.3).

<u>EAR:</u> Export Administration Regulations, which govern exports of dual-use items. Administered by the Bureau of Industry and Security in the Department of Commerce. <u>207.96.48.13/policiesandregulations/index.htm</u>

<u>302(a) Allocations and 302(b) Allocations</u>: The report that accompanies the budget resolution includes a table called the "302(a) allocation." The table distributes by congressional committee the spending totals for each budget function in the budget resolution. Because committee jurisdictions differ somewhat between the House and Senate, the 302(a) allocation tables for each chamber are slightly different. The Appropriations Committee receives a single 302(a) allocation for all of its programs. It then decides on its own how to divide this funding among its 12 subcommittees, creating what are known as 302(b) sub-allocations.

MTA: Material Transfer Agreement:
