Subject: F&A Costs – Resources for Educating Faculty and Administrators

## Dear Colleagues,

Facilities and Administrative (F&A) costs reimbursements are a critical, but often misunderstood, part of the research enterprise. F&A reimbursements help support the infrastructure costs that institutions incur as a result of conducting research, such as electricity, water filtration, lab maintenance, safety mechanisms, and more. The federal government has historically partnered with research universities to pay for these necessary research expenses, just as it does in industry contracts and its own federal laboratories.

While there are no immediate federal policy threats to F&A costs, proposals in recent years have demonstrated a continuing need to inform university administrators and faculty about F&A costs. AAU, together with AAMC, APLU, ACE, COGR, and NACUBO, has developed a short <u>video</u> primer to outline how federal research funds are used and how vital support for F&A related expenses is to keeping America at the forefront of research and innovation.

Additionally, our colleagues at COGR recently released a useful paper on F&A costs reimbursement entitled: "Excellence in Research: The Funding Model, F&A Reimbursement, and Why the System Works."
